How Does Pay-n-Display Work?

What is a multi-space parking meter?

A multi-space meter is a kiosk style machine that can serve multiple parking spaces.

These new kiosk style meters accept US coins (including nickels, dimes, quarters and dollar coins). Additionally, Discover, MasterCard, and Visa credit/debit cards are accepted making it unnecessary for drivers to carry large amounts of change.

The kiosk dispenses pay and display receipts that need to be placed inside the vehicle on the driver's side dashboard facing out.

What Are the Hours of Operation?

Dover's multi-space meters are used Monday through Friday from 7 am to 6 pm.

Can I Use the Remaining Time on My Ticket Somewhere Else?

Any time purchased may be used in any of the metered locations' parking spaces

How Do I Know Where to Pay?

Signs indicating the location of the meters are located throughout the area covered by the meter.



What Are the Meter Rates?

- \$.25 per 20 Minutes
- \$.75 per 1 Hour

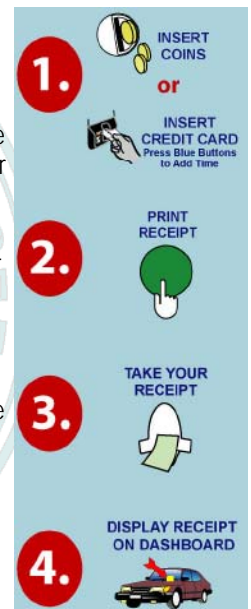
4 HOURS MAXIMUM

The minimum charge for coins is eight (8) minutes for one (1) dime. The minimum charge for

card payments will be one (1) hour for seventy five (75) cents.

How Does It Work?

A driver will insert coins or a credit/debit card into the meter. Once the driver has selected the duration of their stay, they will press the green button to produce the receipt. This receipt



must be displayed on the driver's side dashboard so that an enforcement officer may view it.

FACTS ABOUT DOVER'S MULTI-SPACE METERS

- The multi-space meter program is overseen by the City's Parking Commission
- The 9 meters installed are the first of two phases of meter rollout. Phase II will grow the program to cover the central business district, both on-street parking and public off-street parking. The program will be reviewed and adjusted as needed by the Parking Commission.
- Dover currently has 4 meters installed on Henry Law Avenue (between Washington and River Streets)
- Dover has 4 meters in the Orchard Street Lot, and 1 in the Belknap Lot (off Central Avenue)
- The meters in Orchard Street cover the whole lot, users with permits may park in any space
